

Lesson 3 - At the Restaurant

New Verbs

to like	to go (goes)	meal	weekend	and
to have (has)	to need	window	courteous	or

Conjugate the new verbs in the present. The 3rd person singular is regular (+s) unless noted.

Pronunciation: Sounds of the alphabet...consonants
"V": Victor views a very valuable vehicle.

Review the verb "to do"

Ask questions using the verb "to do" + verbs you have learned.

Answer questions in the positive and the negative.

Examples:

Do you study English?

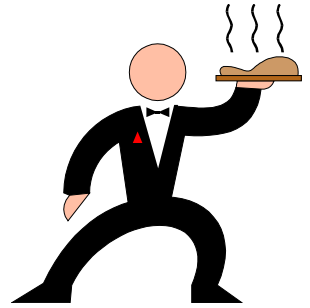
Yes, I study English.

No, I don't study English.

Does she walk to the city?

Yes, she walks to the city.

No, she doesn't walk to the city.

Waiter: I recommend the tuna. It's terrific.

Marcie: Great. I want grilled tuna and a salad, please.

Waiter: Do you want a drink?

Marcie: Yes. I want a glass of white wine, please.

(The waiter brings the meal.)

Waiter: Grilled tuna, a salad and a glass of wine. Do you need anything more?

Marcie: Yes, I need a fork and a napkin.

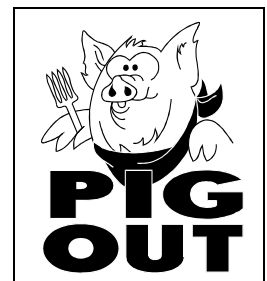
Waiter: Here you are. Enjoy your meal.

(Marcie is finished. The waiter clears the table.)

Waiter: Do you want dessert or coffee?


Marcie: No, thank you, just the check, please.

Waiter: Yes, of course. Here it is. Have a nice evening.

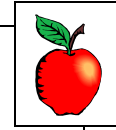

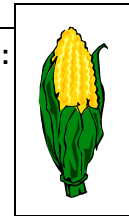
