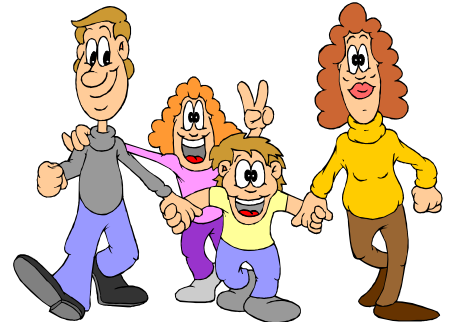


Lesson 4 - A Big Family

Review

Asking questions.

- Word order for questions.
 - You go to the store. Do you go to the store?
 - She is a pretty woman. Is the woman pretty?
- Review homework questions/answers.
- Review positive and negative responses using “and” and “but”.
Example:
 - Do you eat fish?
 - No, I do not (don't) eat fish, but I eat meat.
 - Yes, I eat fish and I also eat meat **or** Yes, I eat fish and I eat meat, too.

Do you drink milk?

Do you like to eat French fries?

Do you need to go to the store?

Do you want a glass of wine?

Do you have to work this afternoon?

- **Pronouns: Replace the person with a pronoun :**
 - Example: Is **Gus** happy? Yes, **he** is happy.

Is Jimmy thirsty?

Does Vinny like to walk?

Are Andres and Ed tired?

Does Angelica study English?

Is Carmen sad?

New verb form: Present progressive

Add **-ing** to the end of the verb and use with “to be”

Example: to walk - walking – I am walking

I am walking to the store (right now or in the process of).

Plurals

To make a noun plural, add “s” or “es” to most nouns.

1 apple	2 apples
1 lunch	2 lunches
1 sister	2 sisters

There are many exceptions. See the grammar guide.

Use progressive with questions:

Example: Where are you going? I am going to the store.

What are you doing?

Who is working?

What are you eating?

Who is studying?

Where are you going?
