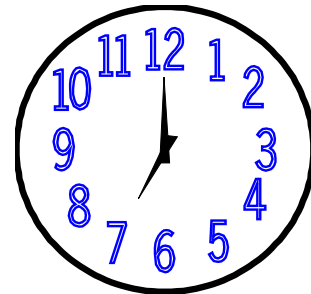

Telling Time

Expressed as **o'clock**, AM, PM

It is 7 o'clock. It is 7PM. It is 7AM.

7:15 = seven fifteen or quarter past (after) seven

7:20 = seven twenty or twenty past (after) seven

7:30 = seven thirty or half past seven

7:45 = seven forty five or quarter to (before, till) eight

12:00PM = Noon

12:00AM = Midnight

Use of prepositions with time.

Examples:

When are you going to Guayaquil?

When do you go to English class?

What day is today?

When are you going to Peru?

When is Easter?

I'm going to Guayaquil **on** Monday. (future)

I go to English class **on** Mondays and Wednesdays. (habit)

Today is Monday. (no preposition needed)

I'm going to Peru **in** January.

Easter is **in** March.

When are you going to the United States?

When is Christmas?

When is Valentine's Day?

Which season is hot?

Which season is cold?

When is Mother's Day?

What day is today?

What day is tomorrow?

When is your day off?

When is the concert? (Use both time of day and day of the week)

When is the next English class?

Writing the Date

In the United States, we write the date:
month/day/year

In Ecuador and Europe, they write the date: day/month year.

Example: July 2, 2005
In U.S.: 7/2/2005

In S. America
& Europe: 2 July 2005
2/7/2005

Personal Pronouns

Nominative (subject)	Possessive (possession)	Objective (direct, indirect objects; after prepositions)
I	my, mine	me
You	your, yours	you
He	his	him
She	her, hers	her
It	its	it
We	our, ours	us
You	your, yours	you
They	their, theirs	them

Examples of objective pronouns: I give the book to him. Object of preposition
I give it to him. Direct object
I give him the book. Indirect object
